Personal Property Inventory Form

The Pennridge Regional Police Department has developed a Personal Property Inventory Form for residents to document their personal belongings. In the event that your property becomes lost or stolen, the police department will have on record, the make, model, serial numbers and descriptions of your valuables.

We ask that you complete the attached forms and send them back to the Pennridge Regional Police Department. The information will be entered into our data base, not to be released. If, in the event of a theft, we will already have the needed information to enter your property into the FBI National Crime Information Center computer system, contact local pawn shops and notify local police departments.

By taking time to complete these forms, we will be able to better serve you. Our goal is to not have your valuables become lost or stolen. In the unfortunate event that your belongings become missing, this greatly increases our chance of solving a crime, arresting a perpetrator and reuniting you with your belongings.

Uniform Crime Report—October Statistics

The Uniform Crime Report contains official data on crime as reported to police departments throughout the United States. Crime data is provided to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, then compiled into the Uniform Crime Report. The report contains crime and arrest data divided into two Parts. Part I crimes are known as “index crimes” and are deemed the most serious offenses. Part I crimes include Homicide, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Theft, Motor Vehicle

Theft and Arson. Part II crimes include all other crimes reported to Law Enforcement.

In November, six Part I crimes and 41 Part II crimes were reported to the Pennridge Regional Police Department.

Police investigated 2 thefts and 4 burglaries / attempted burglaries, 12 acts of vandalism, 1 possession of weapons on school property, 3 drug violations, 2 Driving Under the Influence complaint, 1 offense against family, 5 acts of Disorderly

Conduct and 17 other minor offenses.

Officers arrested 19 persons in November. Police arrested 4 individuals for Theft, 3 persons for vandalism, 4 for drug violations, 2 persons for DUI and 6 persons for Disorderly Conduct.

Tylersport Area Crime Alert Committee

The Tylersport Area Crime Alert Committee began in the summer of 1994 when a rash of home burglaries in Salford Township alarmed a number of residents who decided to take action to help the State Police deal with the problem.

Currently, the committee meets on a monthly schedule at Nannys Family Store in Tylersport with participation from local residents and various police departments, including the Pennridge Regional Police. Over the years, the group has collaborated with local police

and officials of the PA Game Commission to provide local support and information on a number of issues, from illegal poaching around the deer hunting season to its most recent activity helping Salford Township and the State Police deal with missing financial records from 2007.

The leadership for the group is provided by Co-Chair Paul Unruh, of West Rockhill Township, who owns Nannys Family Store, and Co-Chair George Di Domizio of Salford Township. Commander of the Citizen Pa-

trol is Fred Moyer of Salford. The stated mission of the group is: “Serve as the eyes and ears of police officers, PA Game Commission officers and be available to help neighbors in every way possible.”

Membership in the group is open to all residents of Salford, West Rockhill, Marlborough and Franconia townships.
